AJ DYBANTSA

His thunderous, gym-shaking dunks and NBA-range three-pointers - as well as his historic, multi-million-dollar Name, Image and Likeness (NIL) deals - have already made AJ Dybantsa a household name.

But before he was getting buckets out west, Dybansta's basketball foundation was laid much closer to Springfield College's campus.

Born in Boston and raised in Brockton, Mass., Dybansta was already a star by his freshman year at St. Sebastian's School in Needham, Mass. In 2023, he led the Arrows to a 26-2 record and the New England Preparatory School Athletic Council Class A title game while averaging 19.1 points, 9.6 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 2.5 blocks per game on 60.8 percent shooting from the field - including 41 percent on 3-point attempts - Dybantsa was an Independent School League First Team All-Conference selection as well as the 2022-23 Massachusetts Boys' Basketball Gatorade Player of the Year.

Dybansta's standout season cemented him as not only the best player in all of Massachusetts, but also the top recruit in the entire class of 2026. Even after he reclassified from the 2026 class to the 2025 class to kickstart his recruitment process, Dybantsa retained that No. 1 spot, becoming the first to do so from the Bay State since Nerlens Noel in 2012.

Following his tremendous season, Dybansta transferred to Prolific Prep in Napa, Calif. He led Prolific to a Grind Session World Championship last March, and later helped Team USA win gold at the FIBA U17 Basketball World Cup in July. Prior to the 2024-25 season, Dybansta transferred to Utah Prep, citing he believed the school had everything to offer.

Dybansta lives and breathes basketball.



"I have no life, all I do is play basketball, I don't go out at all," Dybansta told The Field Of 68: After Dark.

That obsession with the game is a huge reason why Dybansta's game has improved so quickly. It's not the only reason, however, as he loves a challenge. It's part of the reason he transferred to such premiere high school basketball programs - he knows that in order to be the best, he has to beat the best.

It was obvious within minutes of the opening tip of the 'Iolani Classic Championship in Hawaii on Dec. 21, between Dybansta's Utah Prep and Brewster Academy, why the No. 1 recruit in the class of 2025 and projected 2026 No. 1 NBA draft pick was the most sought-after high school boys basketball player before he committed to Brigham Young University on Dec. 10. Dybantsa led off the game winning the jump ball, outreaching a Brewster big and tipped a pass to a streaking teammate who hammered home a 2-0 lead. Two possessions later, Dybantsa pulled up from the left wing, hitting nothing but the net.

Dybantsa plays the game with a pace that is hard to teach. His feel for when to speed up and slow down a game is a skill that has already wowed NBA veterans. "I was impressed by his size and fluidity as a player, his ball handling," Phoenix Suns forward Kevin Durant told Andscape. "He got the body type to become a pro in this league for 20 years." He trusts his teammates and knows when to make the extra pass, but isn't afraid to shoulder the offense if needed. He can score at all three levels, from rim-punishing dunks to 30-foot threes and anywhere in between. Dybantsa is always a step ahead in getting to his spots, and is hard to contest with his smooth, high-arcing jumper. Defensively, his quick hands and long wingspan make him a constant threat in passing lanes and on the boards.

Combine all of that with his 6-foot-9, 200-pound frame and over 7-foot wingspan and it is evident why the not-so-small forward is one of the best high school recruits of the past decade.

This season alone, Dybansta and Utah Prep have beaten No. 3 Cameron Boozer and Christopher Columbus High School, as well as Nate Ament, the No. 4 recruit who plays for Virginia's Highland School.

And the Spalding HoopHall Classic will be yet another opportunity for Dybansta to show off his skills - and maybe exact some revenge. Last year, Dybansta and Prolific Prep fell 76-71 to Monteverde Academy in a heavyweight slugfest that featured three top players in their respective graduating classes all on the floor at the same time.

Getting the chance to play in his home state is not an opportunity that Dybansta is going to overlook. Coming back to New England for the second time this season after playing in a showcase at Emmanuel College in Boston earlier this season

"Anytime I get to play back home, the crowd shows support and it's good to just play in front of your community," Dybansta told WBZ-TV.



BOOZER TWINS DRAFT

In the world of high school basketball, few stories capture the imagination like that of Cameron and Cayden Boozer. The twin phenoms from Christopher Columbus High School are rewriting the narrative of what it means to dominate as a duo.

Born and raised in Miami, Cameron and Cayden's journey began in the same city where they now shine as high school stars.

Their love for basketball started when they were just three years old, playing at the local Boys & Girls Club. From the backyard battles that fueled their competitive fire to the bright lights of international courts, Cameron and Cayden have always been side by side, pushing each other to be better every step of the way.

Christopher Columbus High is in the midst of another dominant season, with the Boozer twins leading the charge as they aim for a fourth consecutive Florida state championship. Remarkably, the twins have already delivered three straight state titles to a school that had never won one before their arrival.

Their on-court chemistry has propelled the 17-year-olds into the spotlight, making Christopher Columbus one of the top teams to watch at this year's Spalding Hoophall Classic.



Cameron, a 6-foot-9 power forward ranked as ESPN's No. 2 recruit in the class of 2025, is a force in the paint and beyond. His scoring ability, rebounding and defensive prowess make him a dominant force. He was even ranked ahead of projected No. 1 NBA draft pick Cooper Flagg entering the summer of 2023.

"There are a lot of players that plateau in high school," Cameron told Sports Illustrated in October. "My biggest thing is not being one of those guys."

Cayden, a 6-foot-3 point guard ranked as ESPN's No. 17 recruit in the class of 2025, complements his brother with his court vision, perimeter shooting and ability to run the offense. His command of the game is extraordinary—he controls the tempo, reads defenses and consistently makes smart, calculated decisions. Cayden has led the Nike EYBL circuit in assists for two consecutive summers, and his improving three-point shots adds another layer of threat to his already polished offensive skill set.

"I never really thought of it as 'I'm just the other brother.' Cayden said. "I knew I was a good player and I've tried to become better each and every year. Thankfully, I've gotten a lot better since my freshman year and I've gotten the attention I didn't get before."

Despite their different roles, their connection on the court remains their greatest strength.

The twins have been nearly inseparable since birth—both on and off the court. As sons of Carlos Boozer, the former Duke standout and two-time NBA All-Star, basketball has always been in their blood. Yet, they've forged their own path, driven by a relentless work ethic and a sibling rivalry that has only made them better.

Their journey has taken them far beyond Florida. The twins have shined on the international stage, representing Team USA in multiple competitions and bringing home a treasure trove of accolades. They claimed gold medals in the 15U, 16U and 17U Nike Peach Jam tournaments. As a rising junior on the EYBL 16U circuit, Cameron consistently ranked in the top three in both points and rebounds. Going into his senior season, he performed even better, averaging 24.5 points and 13.4 rebounds at the 17U level, leading the circuit in both categories.

At the July Nike Peach Jam, Cameron put up 20.4 points and 10.1 rebounds, leading his team to the title. From June 29-July 7, they represented the United States at the U17 FIBA World Cup in Istanbul, Turkey, where they helped secure its seventh straight gold medal. Cameron's stellar performance earned him the tournament MVP, further solidifying his status as one of the top prospects in the country.

Their commitment to Duke this past fall was no surprise. Following in their father's footsteps, the twins will bring their talents to one of college basketball's most storied programs. Carlos, who starred for the Blue Devils from 1999 to 2002, led them to an NCAA championship in 2001. For Cameron and Cayden, it's about continuing their journey together while honoring the legacy of family and hard work.



"I'm proud of them. They've worked their butts off for this moment." Carlos Boozer told ESPN in October. "Really excited that they took their time. Decided to play together in college, which is amazing. They both complement each other so well. They made the best decision for them. Me and Mom couldn't be any prouder. It's going to be a fun journey."

However, as close as they are. Cameron and Cayden have worked hard to carve out individual identities in the basketball world. Although they did everything together, their mother made sure they weren't just the "Boozer twins." CeCe Boozer ensured that they had opportunities to explore other interests—soccer, baseball, football and even ice hockey-beyond basketball.

"They've fought for [their identity] their entire life," CeCe told Sports Illustrated in October. "Even though they did everything together, I made sure they were both allowed to be their own person."

The twins are aiming for another state championship and preparing for their next chapter at Duke.

"Since I've always had my brother by my side, I've known that I can get through anything because I've always had someone I can trust," Cayden said. "I won't be able to have that if we're not on the same team in the NBA, which is probably unlikely, but I'm going to savor these moments while they last."

OLIVIA VUKOSA

Unselfishness is a challenging skill to teach, but it is an essential one in a team sport.

Olivia Vukosa - a 6-foot-4 center for Christ the King High School (NY) and the No. 5 girls' basketball prospect in the graduating class of 2026, according to ESPN HoopGurlz - exemplified selfless play when she led her team to the New York State Catholic High School Athletic, Association girls' varsity basketball AA state championship last spring.

The five-star prospect from Middle Village, N.Y., didn't just focus on scoring. Instead, she filled, every column on the stat sheet, putting up a double-double (24 points and 16 rebounds) while adding three assists and four blocks as the Lady Royals took down St. Joseph by-the-Sea High 85-63. In addition to her scoring. Vukosa facilitates the ball, runs the floor well and is an excellent passer.

"Mainly this year, something I've gotten a lot better at is being able to facilitate the ball and bring up the ball, and lead a break, which is definitely something that a lot of bigs can't really do," Vukosa told Hardcore Sports Network.

Christ the King coach Bob Mackey, who also coached four-time WNBA champion and five-time Olympic gold medalist Sue Bird as a high schooler, praised Vukosa's selflessness.

"She doesn't care if she scores five points or scores 25 points," Mackey told PIX11 News, "It doesn't matter to her. She's got that mentality of 'team wins. this is what we do."



The polished post player's selflessness was on display again on the international stage last summer. With Croatia leading Puerto Rico 74-62 in the opening game of the FIBA U17 Women's Basketball World Cup, Vukosa got the ball at the top of the three-point line. 27 seconds remained as two defenders hovered in front of her while she swiftly scanned the court for options. Instead of taking the shot. Vukosa passed the ball left to her unquarded teammate. Lena Bilic, who nailed a three-pointer to put the game further out of reach. Croatia notched a 77-65 triumph, the country's first ever victory at the tournament.

The win wasn't the only history Vukosa made that day. She had 23 rebounds, which tied for second-most in the tournament's history, including 16 defensive boards, the most ever in the competition. Then, in Croatia's final game of the World Cup, a 86-76 win over Chinese Taipei, Vukosa became the first player to earn a performance efficiency valuation of 50, after putting up another astounding double-double (31 points and 24 rebounds), while also racking up six blocks, three steals and two assists. She was named the tournament's Best Defensive Player.

Nicknamed "Big O" and named after Olivia Benson, the main character in "Law & Order: Special Victims Unit" - her parents' favorite show - Vukosa has become a star herself. She might be one of the best centers in the country, but she doesn't need to be the center of attention.

"She just wants to play," her father, Damir, told PIX11 News.

Vukosa, who hails from Middle Village, N.Y., played for Croatia because her grandparents are originally from the European Republic. The 16-year-old also starred for the Nike Elite Youth Basketball team Philly Rise, in the Overtime Select league, and in the ACES Elite Classic. But she remains a New Yorker at heart.

"To me, NYC basketball means that I am part of a culture and an ongoing legacy," Vukosa told MSG Networks. "I also love playing basketball in the city where I was born and raised."

The 16-year-old has become one of the most sought-after players in the country, and has already received offers from more than 30 college teams. She and Christ the King will take the floor twice at Hoophall, facing Ontario Christian (CA) at 3 p.m. on Jan. 17 and Sacred Heart (CT) at 9 a.m. on Jan. 18. The attention and adulation hasn't stopped Vukosa from grinding, however.

"She pushes it in practice every day, she pushes it in games," her coach said. "The kid doesn't take days off."

Just like her namesake, Vukosa is the protagonist and the quintessential problem-solving New Yorker, prioritizing the team first while functioning as a master navigator, solving each and every case on the court.

"Me and my team, all we care about is winning and playing together," Vukosa said. "And really building that chemistry for years to come."



KALEENA SMITH

Ontario Christian High School guard Kaleena Smith might be small in stature, but the 5-foot-6 sophomore has already made a big impact.

Smith, a 16-year-old who hails from Perris, Calif., which lies about 70 miles east of Los Angeles, made history in November by signing with Adidas as its first high school girls basketball NIL (Name, Image and Likeness) partner. She was also Adidas' first signing under its new President of Women's basketball, Candace Parker, who is a three-time WNBA Champion and two-time WNBA MVP.

"When I think about the future of women's basketball, it's clear it's in good hands with hoopers like Kaleena," Parker said.

Smith's signing could open the door for other high school phenoms to ink notable NIL deals. When it came to picking a high school player to represent their brand, Smith stood out as a logical choice to Parker and Adidas. She is ranked as the No. 1 player in the class of 2027, according to ESPN, and was MaxPreps National Freshman of the Year following her stellar first campaign at Ontario Christian.

The five-star prospect is the shortest player to be ranked first in ESPN's recruiting rankings in 20 years, but she does not let her size define her impact on the court.

"I'm just trying to prove people wrong," Smith told The Next. "A lot of people see my height and say 'Oh she's too small, she won't make it to college. She already



hit her ceiling.' So really just having that mindset around proving people wrong, whether it's scoring or getting [my teammates] involved, I feel like I'm different from everyone else."

Smith can score from anywhere on the floor. She averaged a shade under 35 points per game last season - eclipsing the 1,000-point mark, a major accomplishment for many high school basketball players - in just her 31st career high school game.

Her elite shooting ability makes her a threat to score from the second she steps over half court and a smooth, dynamic handle allows her to drive to the rim and create shots in the mid-range area.

Smith also makes an impact in other ways. Being a scoring weapon helps free up her teammates for easy looks, and she is also a tenacious and aggressive defensive plaver.

Smith led Ontario Christian to a 28-5 record last season, and the Knights began this year with a 14-game winning streak. They were 17-1 and ranked No. 2 in the nationby MaxPreps - one spot ahead of one of their HoopHall Classic opponent, Morris Catholic - as of Dec. 30.

Smith's success is nothing new however. USA Today described her as a "basketball prodigy" back in 2017 when Smith was just 8 years old and competing against and dominated — boys players in Southern California. That's where Smith earned her nickname: Special K.

"When I was younger, I mostly played against boys until I reached high school," Smith told The Next. "People would call me 'Special' and my nickname was 'K,' so my family and my old coach put it together."

Smith received her first Division I college offer - from California Baptist - before she was even a teenager, and has also drawn interest from powerhouse schools like South Carolina, UConn, LSU, Baylor, Notre Dame, Tennessee and USC.

The Spalding Hoophall Classic will provide another chance for Smith to shine on the national stage. Special K is taking the ever-brighter spotlight in stride.

"Around California people know me but my brand and my image have expanded more nationally over the last year," she told the Los Angeles Times. "I'm comfortable with it now... I love it."




